What is the Best Way to Form Mentors and Leaders?

Pastor **Ghislain Yamongbe Guezo** (Benin) founded a publishing house in Benin. He team-taught a yearlong Zoom mentoring course using the book *Multiplying Leaders*. He is also advisor to SF’s board.



Rev. **Maxime Kakpo** (Benin) is President of the Federation of Evangelical Missions and Churches of Benin. He took the one-year distance training course.



Maxime Kasongo Mwenyi (DRC) is an ophthalmologist who shares the vision for mentoring and has taught with Alain in Burkina Faso, Mali, and the DRC.



Didier Baloussa (CAR) has participated in several evangelists’ fora. His national responsibilities include leading mentorship development.



Daniel Nassa (Burkina Faso), a key influencer, pastor, retired businessman, and member of France Évangélisation, organized several fora and is very active in evangelism.



Gautier Pomkap (Cameroon) is a pastor who has organized several fora in Yaoundé and served as the Central African correspondent for the Forum of Evangelists.



Annette Nikiéma (Burkina Faso) is an evangelist and oncology nurse, once the only certified nurse in the country with training in palliative care. She provides palliative care training and is involved with the country’s health authorities.



Adeline Tchiakoua (Cameroon) is an evangelist, teacher, and trainer. She works with CRU Cameroon and teaches at the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Yaoundé. By faith and perseverance, her ministry is making inroads into her country.



Pastor-Evangelist **Jeff Simdinatome** (Togo) organized an evangelists’ forum in Lomé. Alain first met him in Cape Town in 2010. He has taught with Alain on several occasions in various countries and completed the year-long Zoom training.



A participant in the 4th Lausanne Congress, **Jacques Luwaku** (DRC) trains evangelists and mentors young couples in building strong marriages.
